Georgia's 63 Public Library Systems



Effective FY 2015, Burke County joined the Greater Clarks Hill Regional Library System and the East Central Georgia Regional Library System was renamed the Augusta-Richmond Public Library System



The 2018 edition of "A Current Look at Georgia's Public Libraries and GPLS" is now available, offering a detailed examination of the statistical data that describes the operations, funding, and usage of the over 400 public library facilities throughout our state. This report highlights the value of each of these libraries and the services and programs they offer in every county in Georgia through the 63 public library systems.

This report offers statistical data and analysis of Fiscal Year 2018, which began July 1, 2017, and ended June 30, 2018. Each of the 63 public library systems submits an annual report to GPLS; these annual reports provide the data utilized in the preparation of "A Current Look." Our aggregate data was submitted, as required, to the federal Institute for Museum and Library Services (IMLS) in spring 2019 for inclusion in the national Public Libraries Survey, which provides a national view of public library facilities, services, and funding.

"A Current Look" provides detailed data in ways we hope are useful to those who fund, support, and use public libraries in Georgia. This year, our libraries continued to add patrons as well as the resources and services to meet the needs of residents across the state. For the second year in a row, in FY2018, the state provided 25 cent per capita materials grant to public libraries. These funds allowed libraries to purchase the materials that resulted in Georgia libraries circulating over 35 million items, with 13% more of the high demand e-books being offered at libraries in FY2018 than in FY2017. Live Oak Public Libraries joined the PINES system during FY2018, which increased both the number of patrons and materials within the PINES network.

Public libraries remain essential to the success of education at every level throughout the state. They support students and parents by providing preschool and pre-literacy programs as well as resources for K-12 and higher education. Libraries play a vital role in the state's workforce development, providing resources to adults pursuing new career paths or re-training programs, and to those who need access to online services from local, state and federal government agencies. Offering free Wi-Fi at each of our public libraries helps ensure this need is met.

To the community leaders, trustees, administrators, and funders at the state and local level, whose support makes the services we deliver to every community possible, we are grateful. Together we make Georgia's public libraries successful and meaningful places for Georgians.

Georgia Library Laws

- By statutory authority, Georgia Public Library Service, as a unit of the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia, gives aid, counsel and advice to all libraries in Georgia and works in a limited supervisory capacity with the 63 public library systems.
- **OCGA § 20-5-2 (a)** states that the agency "... shall give aid, advice and counsel to all libraries" and "shall exercise supervision over all public libraries and endeavor to improve libraries already established."
- **OCGA § 20-2-305 (a)** states that the agency "... shall annually determine and request of the General Assembly the amount of funds needed for county and regional public libraries" and that "Public Library funds shall be apportioned to county and regional public libraries in proportion to the area and population to be served by such libraries . . ."
- Public library systems in Georgia are either single-county or multiple-county, based on the individual participating agreements. There are currently 34 multiple-county (regional) public library systems and 29 single-county public library systems. **OCGA § 20-5-41** places authority of single-county library systems with the county board of trustees and places authority of multiple-county library systems with the regional board of trustees.
- While GPLS strongly supports efficiency and economy in the operation of public library systems, it realizes that local preferences, history and political realities drive the decisions of how public libraries are configured and aligned. It is the role of GPLS to advocate for strong, fiscally sound and viable public libraries.

Value of Public Library Services

If a **family of four** borrows two hardcover books, two e-books, and two DVDs each month, attends one program per quarter, and annually takes advantage of the museum and attraction passes available at every public library in the state, that family would **save almost \$1,800 every year** over the cost of buying those materials and tickets individually. *In addition, there is the value of public-access Internet, job skills training, homework help, and dozens of other services that Georgia libraries routinely provide free of charge!*

- **2 hardcover books per month for a year**
 - The average book costs \$26.00.
 - This saved the family of four a total of **\$624**.
- **2 e-books per month for a year**
 - The average eBook consumer cost is \$12.77.
 - This saved the family of four a total of **\$306**.
- **2 DVDs per month for a year**
 - The average DVD costs \$15.00.
 - This saved the family of four a total of **\$360**.
- **1 library program per quarter**
 - The average cost of a movie ticket is \$9.16.
 - This saved the family of four a total of **\$147**.
- **1 time per year using the Passes from the Breman Museum, Center for Puppetry Arts, Chattahoochee Nature Center, Georgia State Parks and Historic Sites, Go Fish Education Center, and the Michael C. Carlos Museum.** This saved the family of four a total of **\$352**.

In 2018, the value of public library services is almost **\$1800 for just these services!**

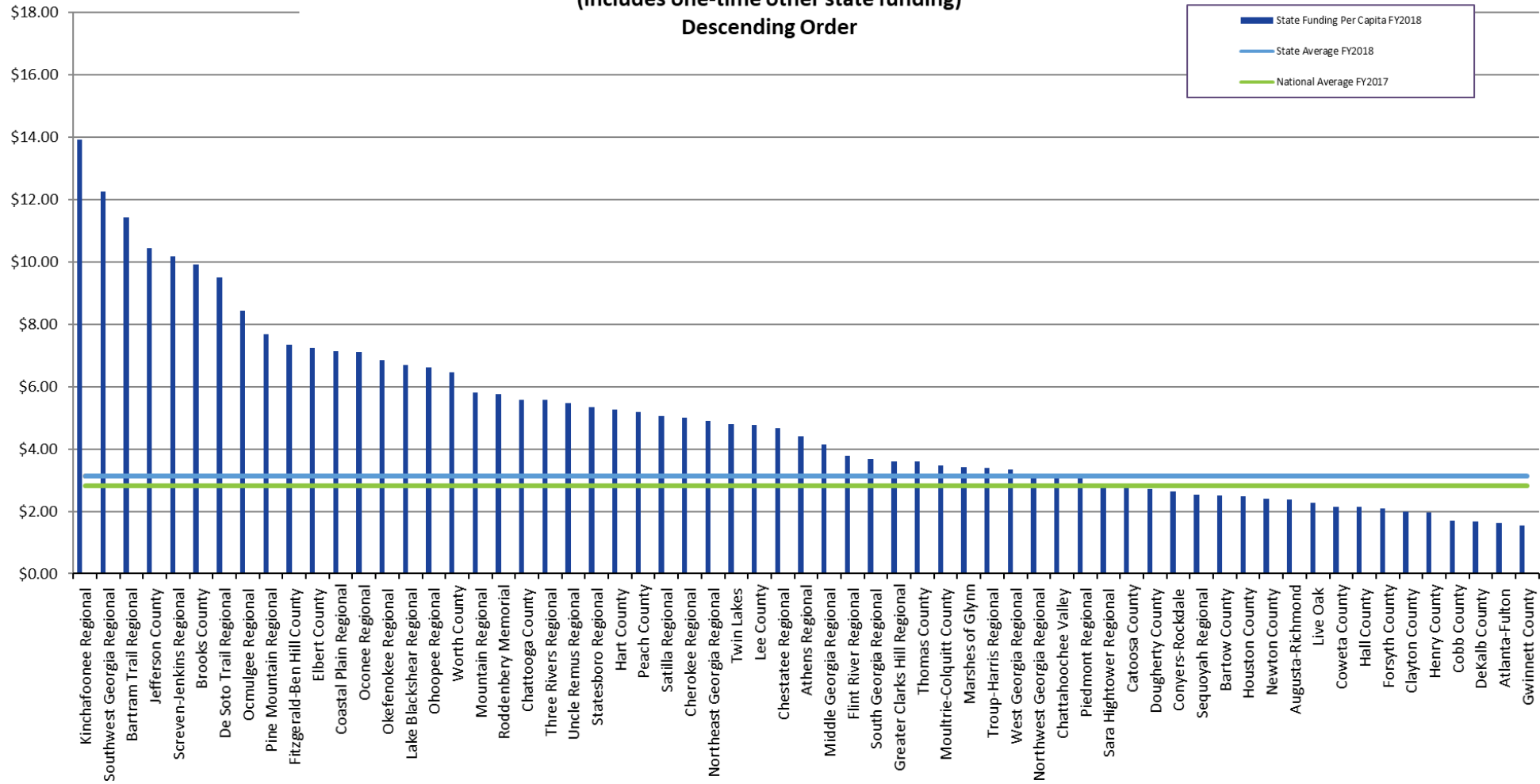
State Grant Funding for Public Libraries

- By state law OCGA § 20-5-3, state grant funding is apportioned by formula to the library systems on the basis of population and geography (http://www.georgialibraries.org/lib/library_laws/OCGA - 20-5-3.pdf).
- State grant funding is provided for professional salaries, library materials, operational support, libraries for the blind and physically handicapped, and, by grant award, for capital improvement.
- Georgia is the only state that provides grants that are specifically designated for the salaries of professional librarians, thus ensuring that each system is administered and led by licensed librarians.
- In FY2017, Georgia ranked 11th in the nation in terms of state funding per capita for public libraries, at \$2.99 while the national average was \$2.82.
- Even with the significant funding provided by the state, in FY2017, Georgia ranked 49th in the nation in terms of **total** per capita funding of public libraries at \$19.12. The national average for **total** per capita funding was \$42.34. Note that FY2017 is the most recent year for which IMLS has published national data tables.
- In FY2018, Georgia's per capita state funding was \$3.12. This included a \$0.25 per capita materials grant.

(includes one-time other state funding)

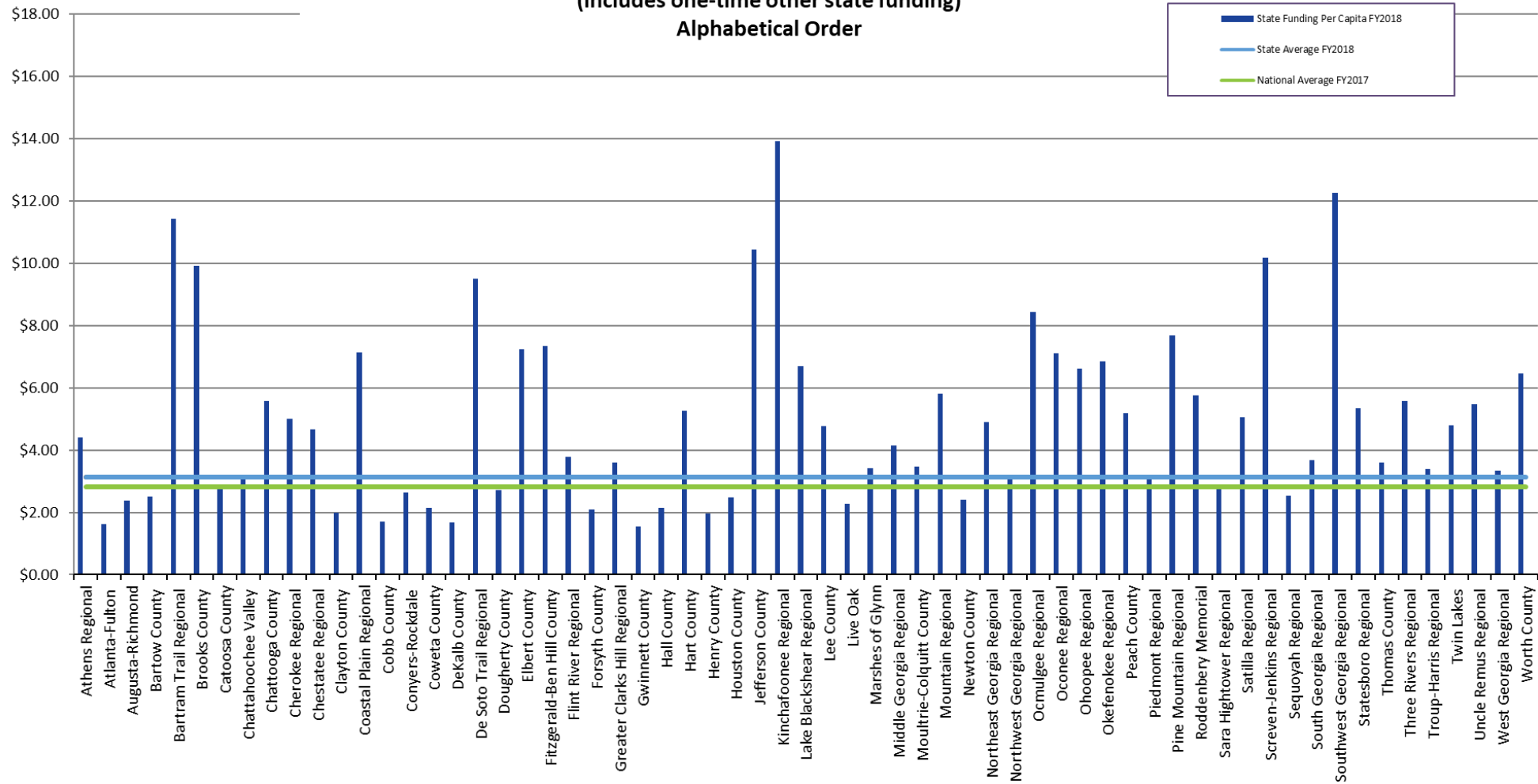

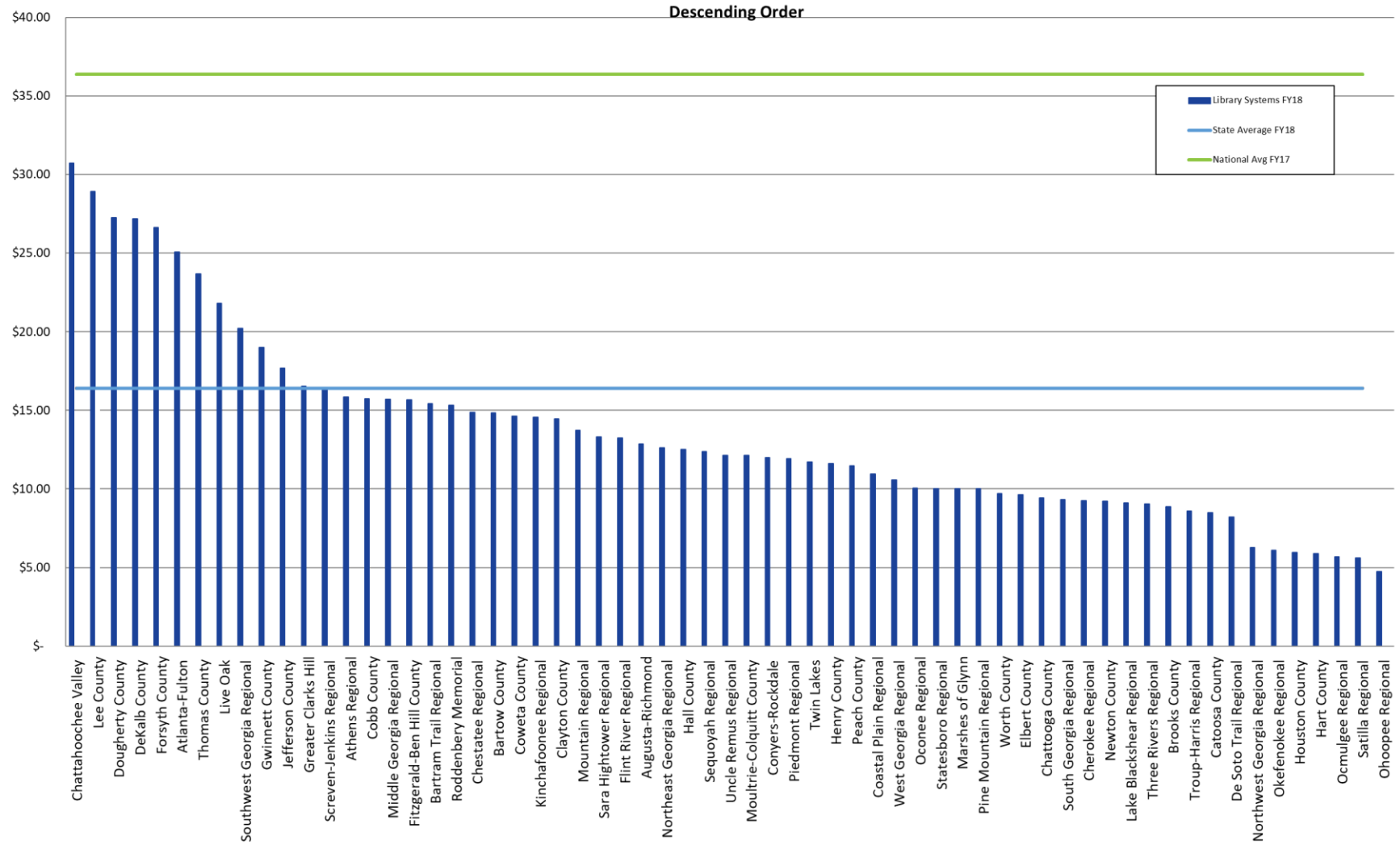

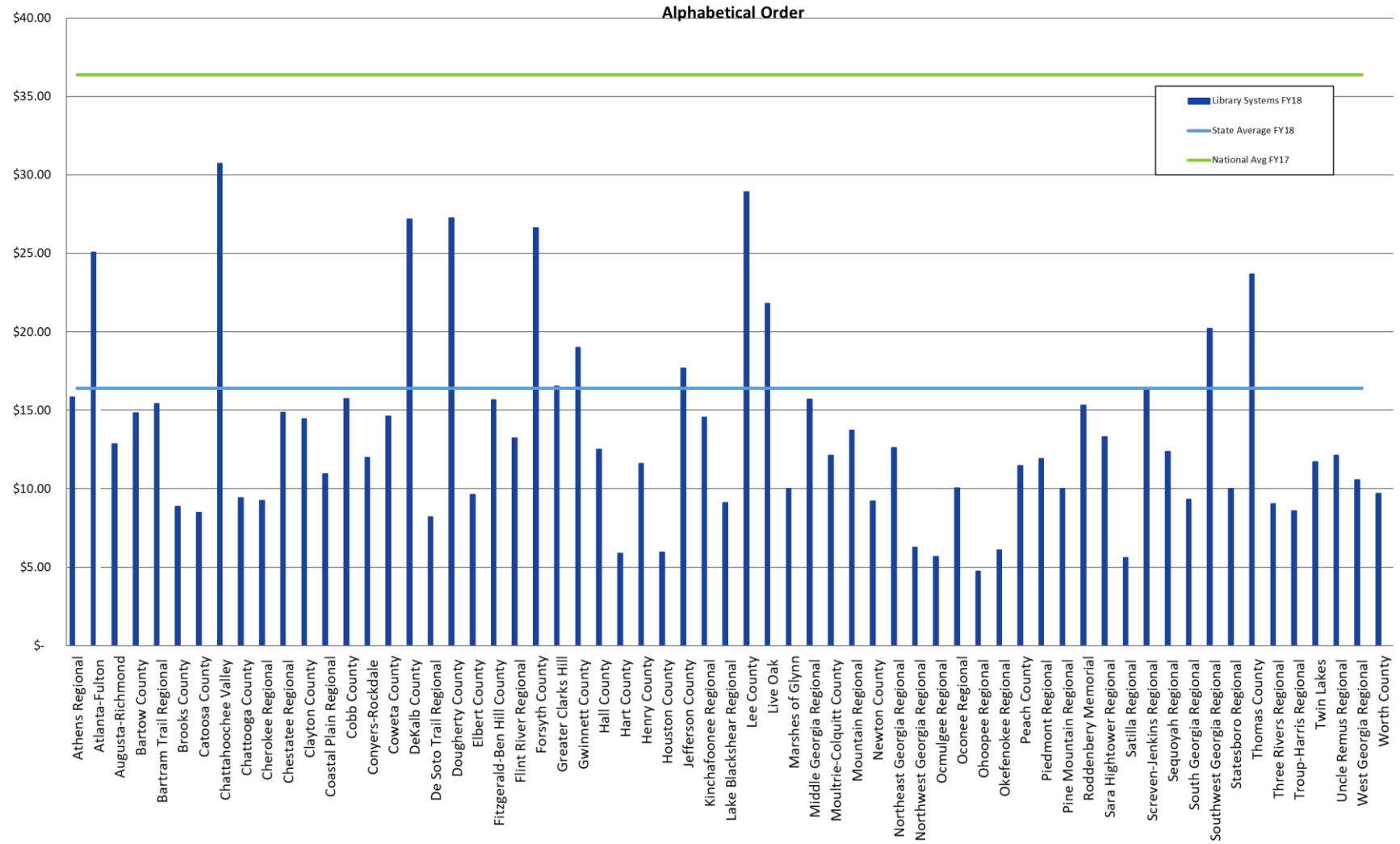
Local Funding for Public Libraries

- By statutory authority, Georgia Public Library Service, as a unit of the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia, gives aid, counsel and advice to all libraries in Georgia and works in a limited supervisory capacity with the 62 public library systems.
- Local funding (including one-time funding but not capital funding) for Georgia's public libraries varied widely across the state in FY2018, from Ochopee Regional Library System at \$4.73 per capita to Chattahoochee Valley Libraries at \$30.71 per capita. In FY2017, local funding ranged from \$4.59 to \$28.92 per capita.
- The majority of the public library systems in Georgia (over 79%) received local funding that was below the statewide average of \$15.61.
- For FY2018, local funding for **all** 63 of Georgia's library systems was below the FY2017 national average of \$36.37.
- Georgia ranked 47th in the nation in local funding per capita for public libraries in FY2017.
- Five public library systems (Brooks County Public Library, De Soto Trail Regional Library System, Ocmulgee Regional Library System, Ochopee Regional Library System, Okefenokee Regional Library System) received more state funding than local funding.
- When reviewing the amount of funding provided to all Georgia libraries by state and local sources, 16% came from the state while 84% came from local sources.

Local Funding Per Capita FY2018



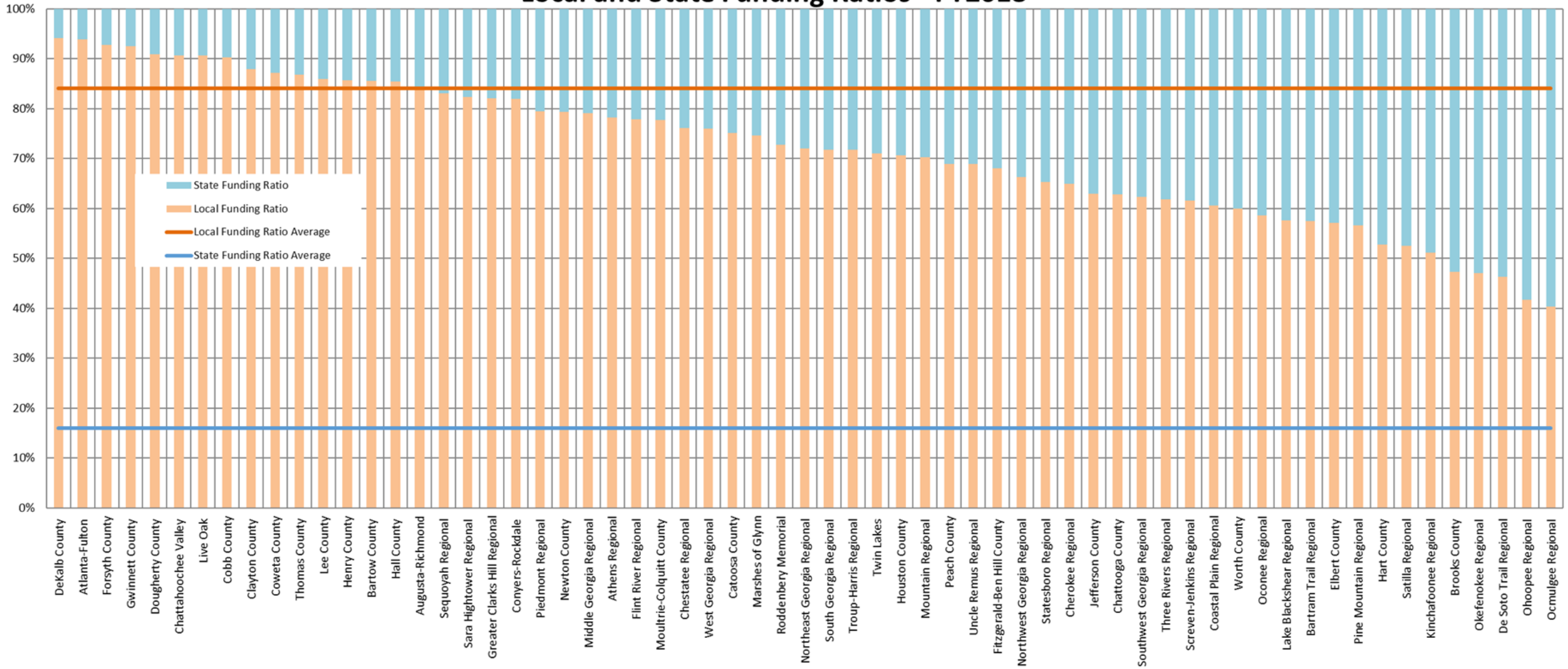
Local Funding Per Capita FY2018

- FY2018 – Granted \$4.0 million matched with \$1.9 million in local contributions, currently assisting over 44 libraries
 - 54 individual projects in 38 counties

 - 54 individual projects in 33 counties
- FY2016 – Granted \$1.885 million matched with \$1.7 million in local contributions, currently assisting over 48 libraries
 - 71 individual projects in 34 counties

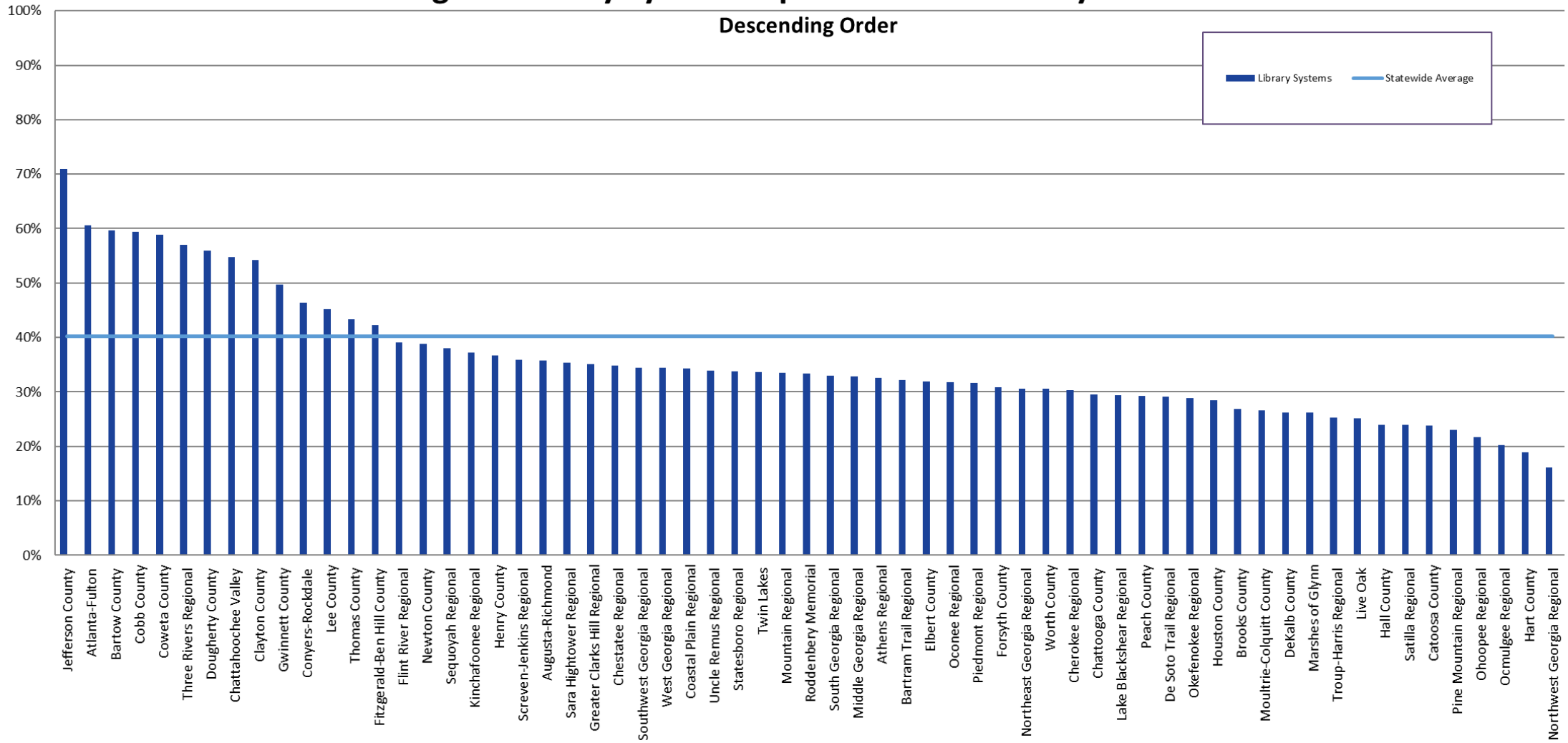

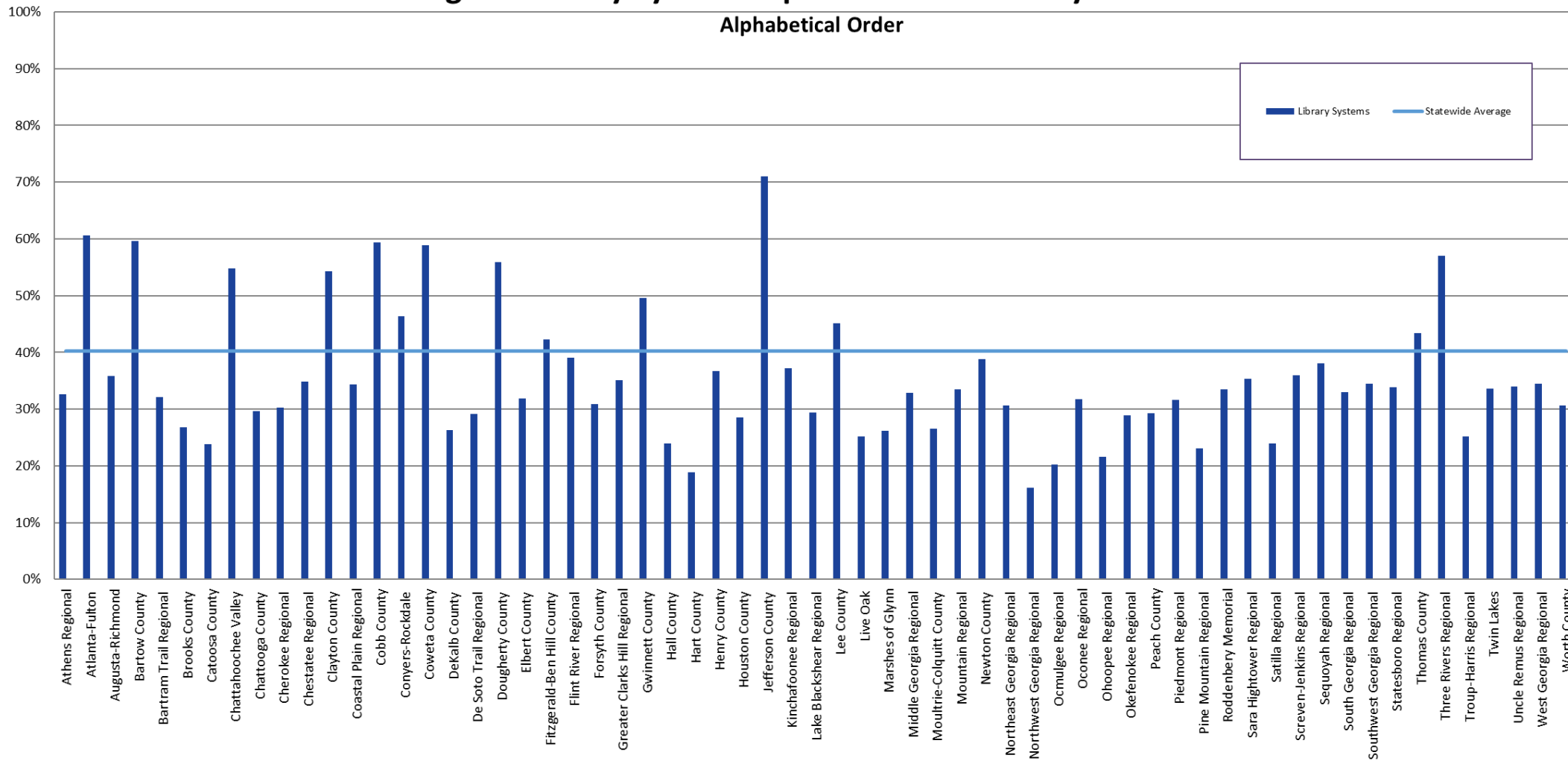
- In FY2018, 4,276,595 individuals in Georgia held public library cards, a negligible decrease of less than two-tenths of a percent over FY2017. The latest Georgia QuickFacts from the U.S. Census (2015-2019) reported a total of 3,758,798 Georgia households, resulting in an average of 1.14 registered public library patrons per Georgia household.
- 40% of all Georgians are registered public library patrons. The actual number of cardholders is almost unchanged from FY2017.
- Library systems that participate in Georgia Public Library Service's PINES automation and lending network counted 1.92 million active PINES library cards as of June 30, 2018.
- More than half of all registered public library patrons in Georgia live in a county that is part of a library system that participates in PINES.
- Georgia libraries circulated almost 35.2 million library items or 3.31 items per capita in FY2018, which is a minimal decrease of less than 1% from FY2017.
- Georgia ranked 49th among states in circulation per capita in FY2017.

Percentage of Library System Population with Library Cards - FY2018

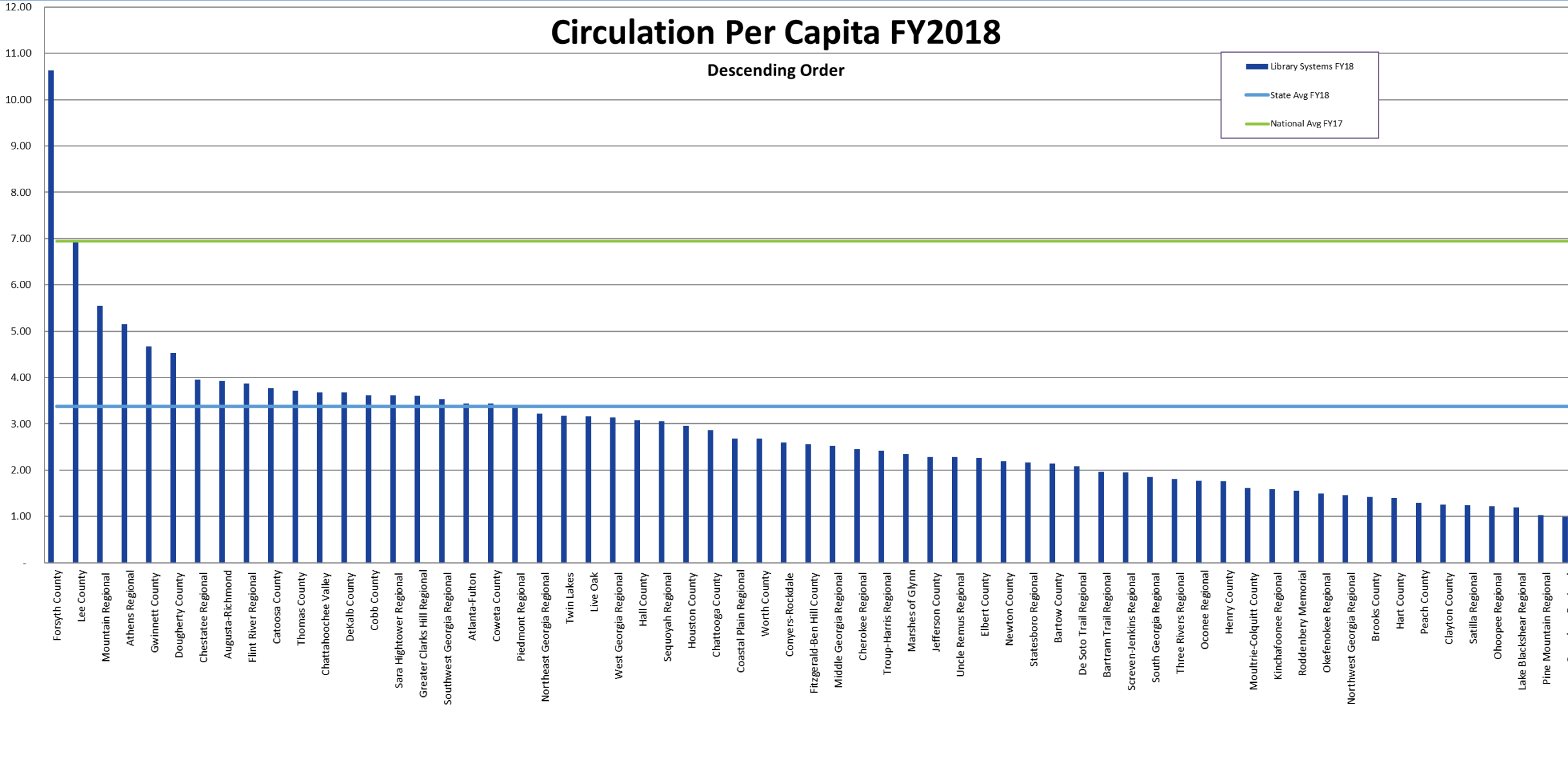
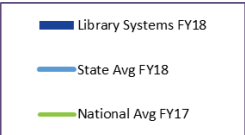

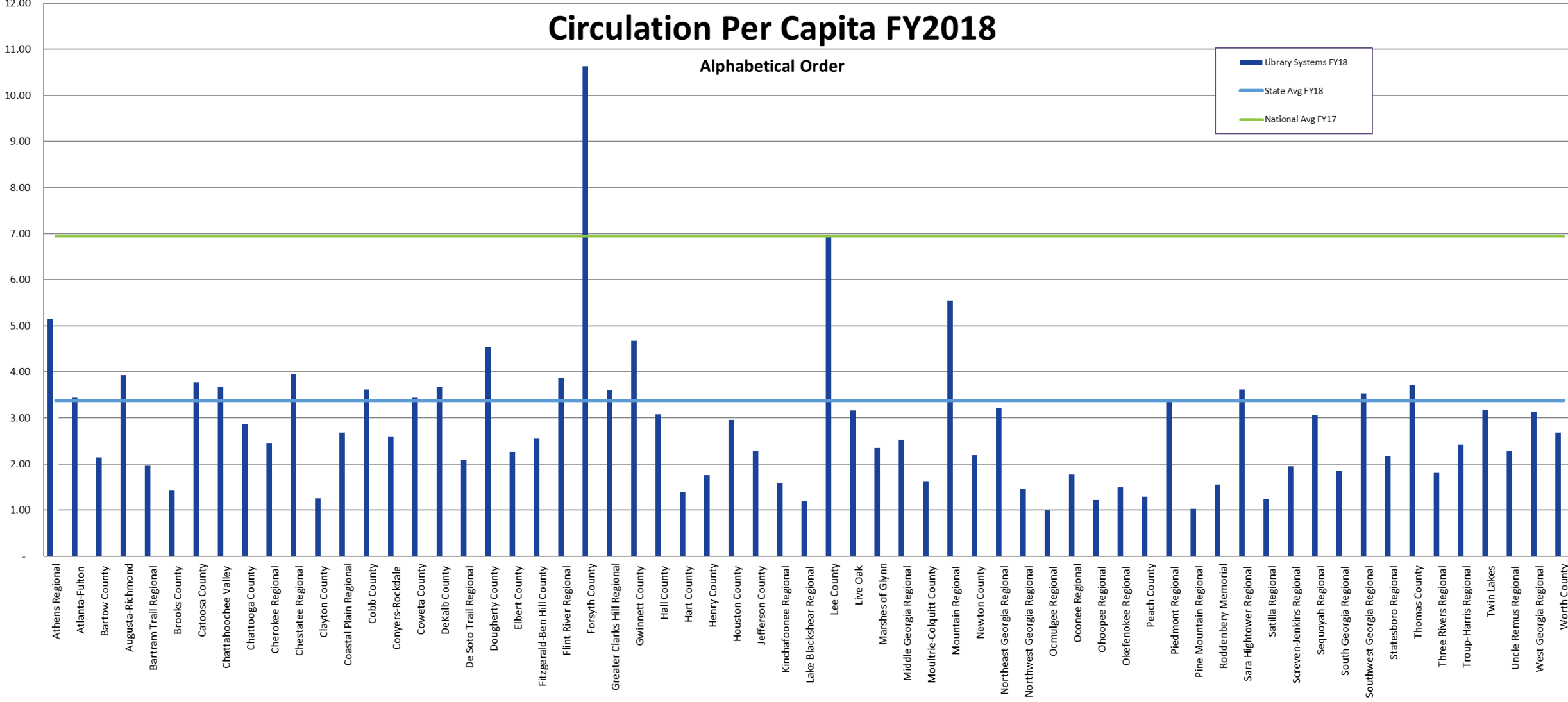
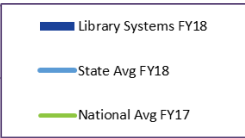
Circulation Per Capita FY2018

Resource Sharing—Interlibrary Loans and Courier Service

- Public libraries provide lending services to their card holders. Each time a user checks out an item, it is considered a circulation. Another type of circulation, which requires at least three times the workload of a circulation, is Interlibrary Loan. This is a service where a user of one library can borrow books that are owned by another library. The user makes a request with their local library, which identifies libraries that own the desired item, places the request, receives the item, makes it available to the user, and arranges for its return.
- Georgia Online Database (GOLD) – GPLS coordinates the interlibrary loaning of books and other materials between libraries of all types including academic, public, technical schools and special libraries. Over 200 institutions loaned and borrowed over 36,750 items between each other in FY2018.
- GPLS contracts for library **courier service**, which transported **1,515,800** library materials in FY2018, visiting every headquarters library five (5) days per week. This includes Interlibrary Loan items as well as PINES system-to-system items being transported across the state.
- Both Interlibrary Loan and PINES system-to-system loans require the librarian to receive the request, pull the book from the shelves, check it out of the online library catalog, and prepare a mailing package or a PINES courier package to send the item to the requesting library. This work is overlooked when using only circulation as a statistic for workload of the library staff, but it accounted for 662,625 items sent to other library systems for patron use. Of these loans, 642,239 were processed through the Georgia Library PINES network.

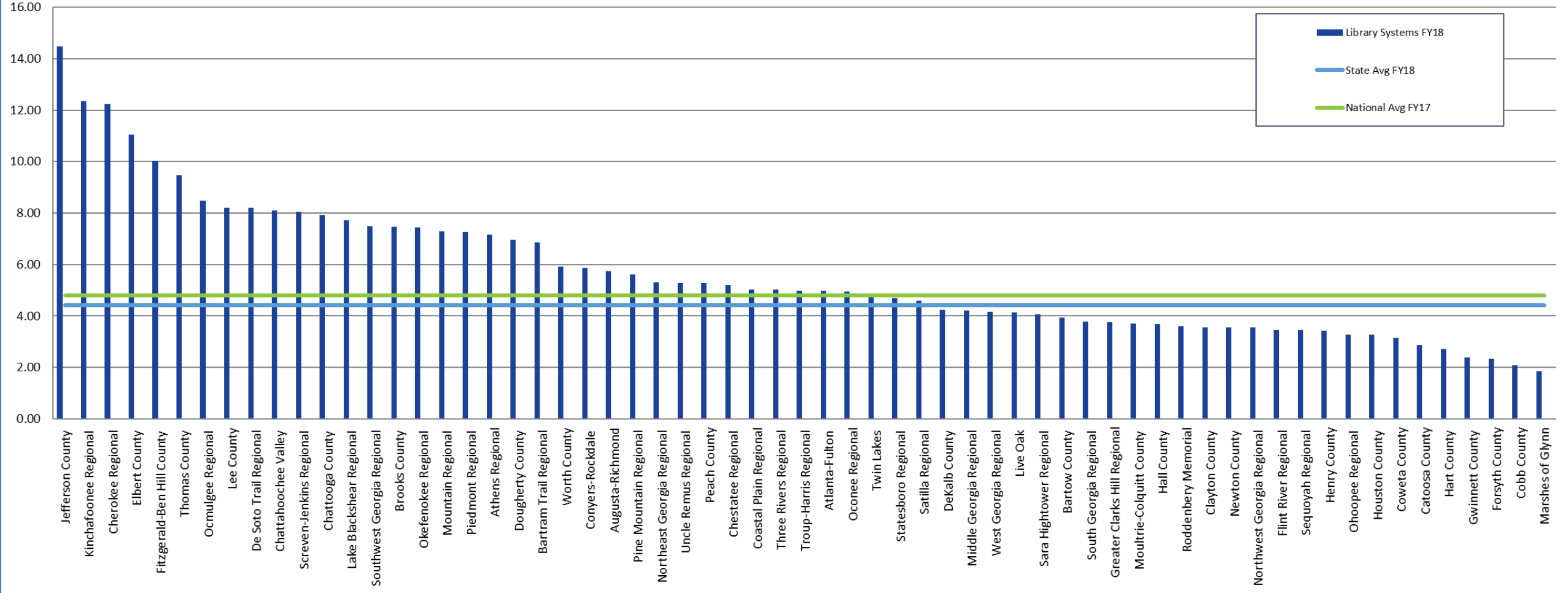

Public Access Computers and Wi-Fi

- Public Library internet computers were used almost 12.5 million times in FY2018. This is a slight increase above FY2017.
- There were 9,391 public computer workstations with high-speed internet access in Georgia public libraries at the close of FY2018.
- All public access internet computers have access to GALILEO databases.
- The total of GALILEO online database usage is 1,426,161 and included Mango language sessions, Learning Express sessions, TumbleBooks, and Gale Legal Forms.
- In FY2018, all Georgia public library buildings provided wireless services for library users. The total wireless sessions used, estimated based on 330 tracking libraries, was almost 3.9 million sessions.
- NOTE: The following Charts and Spreadsheets on “Public Access Computers” use do not include use from patrons’ wireless devices.

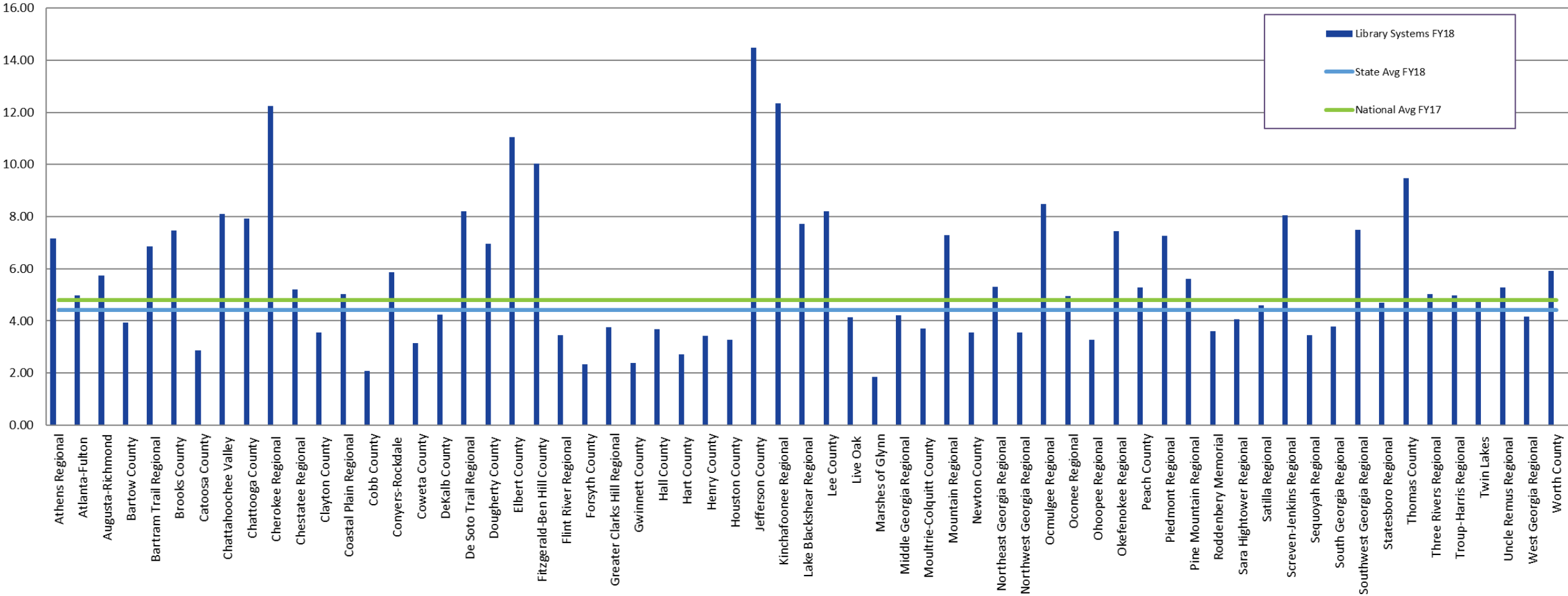
Public Access Computers per 5,000 Population for FY2018

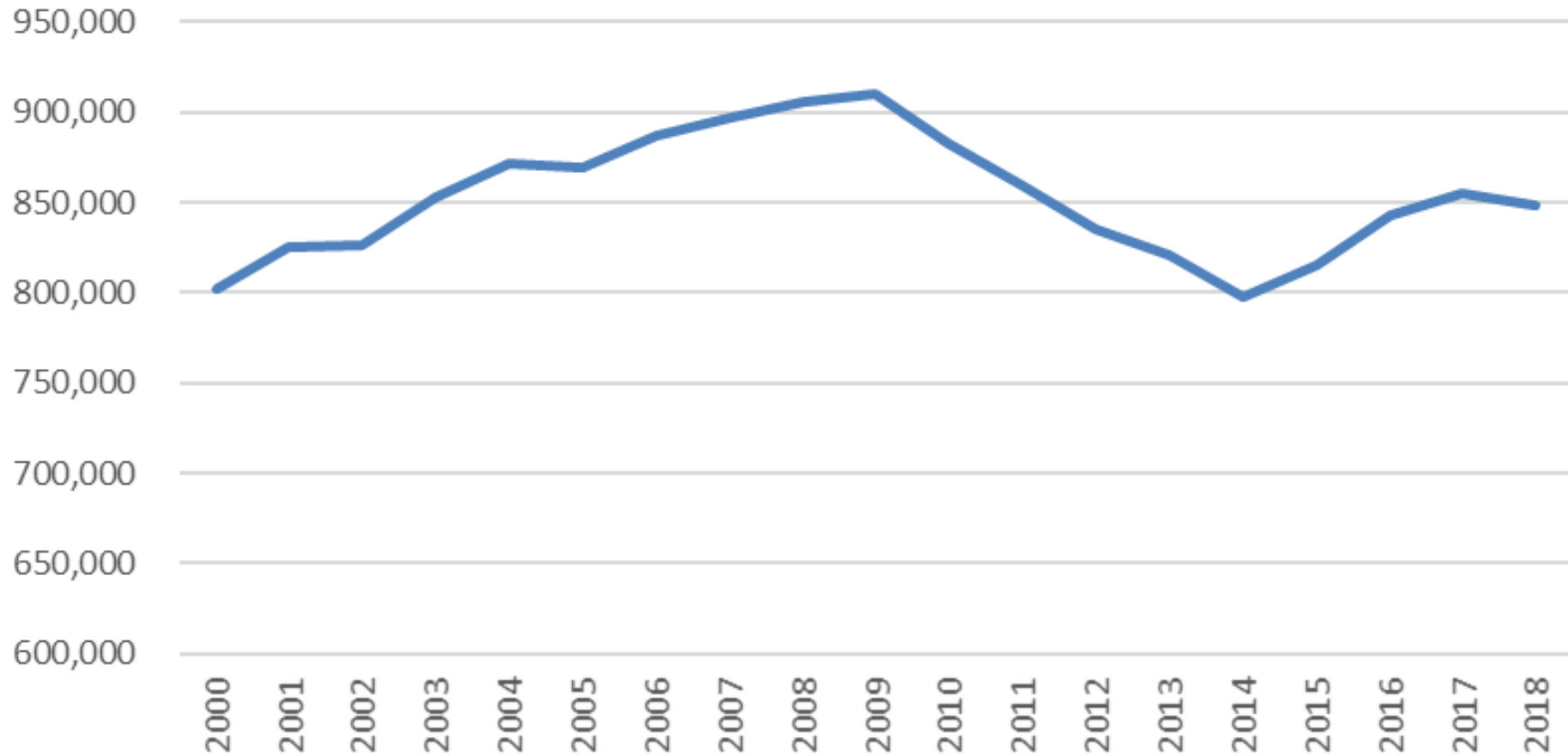

Public Service Hours

- In FY2018, public service hours in Georgia decreased less than 1% over FY2017; this is so small a decrease it is considered flat and there are offsetting increases and decreases in hours throughout Georgia. The previous three years showed an increase in hours which were the first increases since FY2008. From FY2009-2014, due to reduced local and state funding, hours steadily decreased. Despite the overall increase since FY2015, FY2018 hours remain over 6% lower than in FY2009.
- 16 of the 63 public library systems show increased hours over FY2009. Of those, 4 systems (DeKalb County, Forsyth County, Newton County, and Uncle Remus Regional) have increased their public service hours by more than 19% from that time period.
- 43 systems have been forced to reduce public service hours since FY2009, with 16 systems reducing hours more than 20% since then.

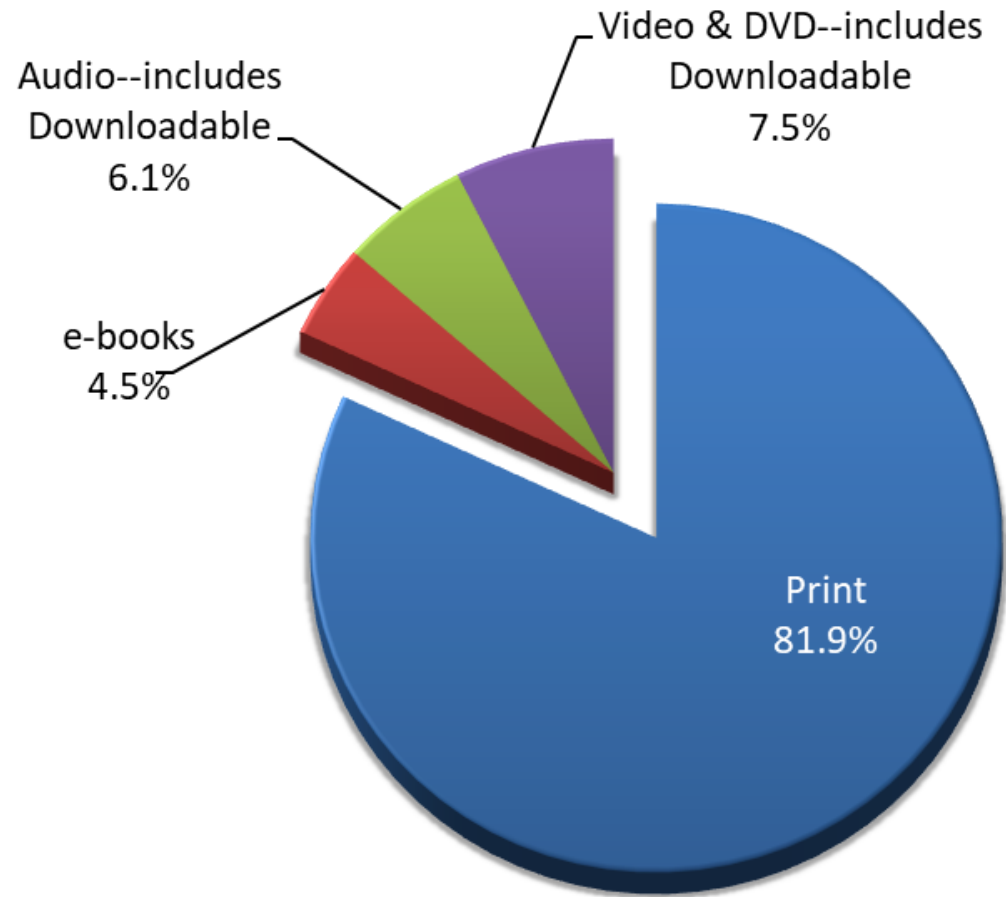
Collections Owned by Georgia Public Libraries

- At the end of FY2018, there were 19,013,622 (1.79 per capita) print books, e-books, audio, and video items in the collections of Georgia public libraries. Audio and video include downloadable.
- 63% of Georgia public library systems were above the state average of 1.79 items per capita.
- As the population of Georgia has grown, the state's ranking in print materials per capita has remained near the bottom; Georgia ranked 43rd in the nation in this category in FY2017.
- In 2018, the number of e-books offered to the public increased over 13% from FY2017, as libraries continue to meet growing demand for this format.

Per capita Expenditures for Books and Other Library Materials

- Georgia public libraries spent an average of \$1.68 per capita for materials in FY2018.
- The per capita expenditure for materials in Georgia public libraries has historically been below the national average, which in FY2017 was \$4.39 per capita; Georgia ranked 49th with an expenditure per capita of \$1.77. In FY2018, no Georgia libraries were as high as the national average although five systems, Chattahoochee Valley Libraries, DeKalb County, Dougherty County, Forsyth County, and Lee County Library were all above \$3 per capita for total collection expenditures.
- 78% of Georgia public library systems fell below the state average of \$1.68 per capita for FY2018.

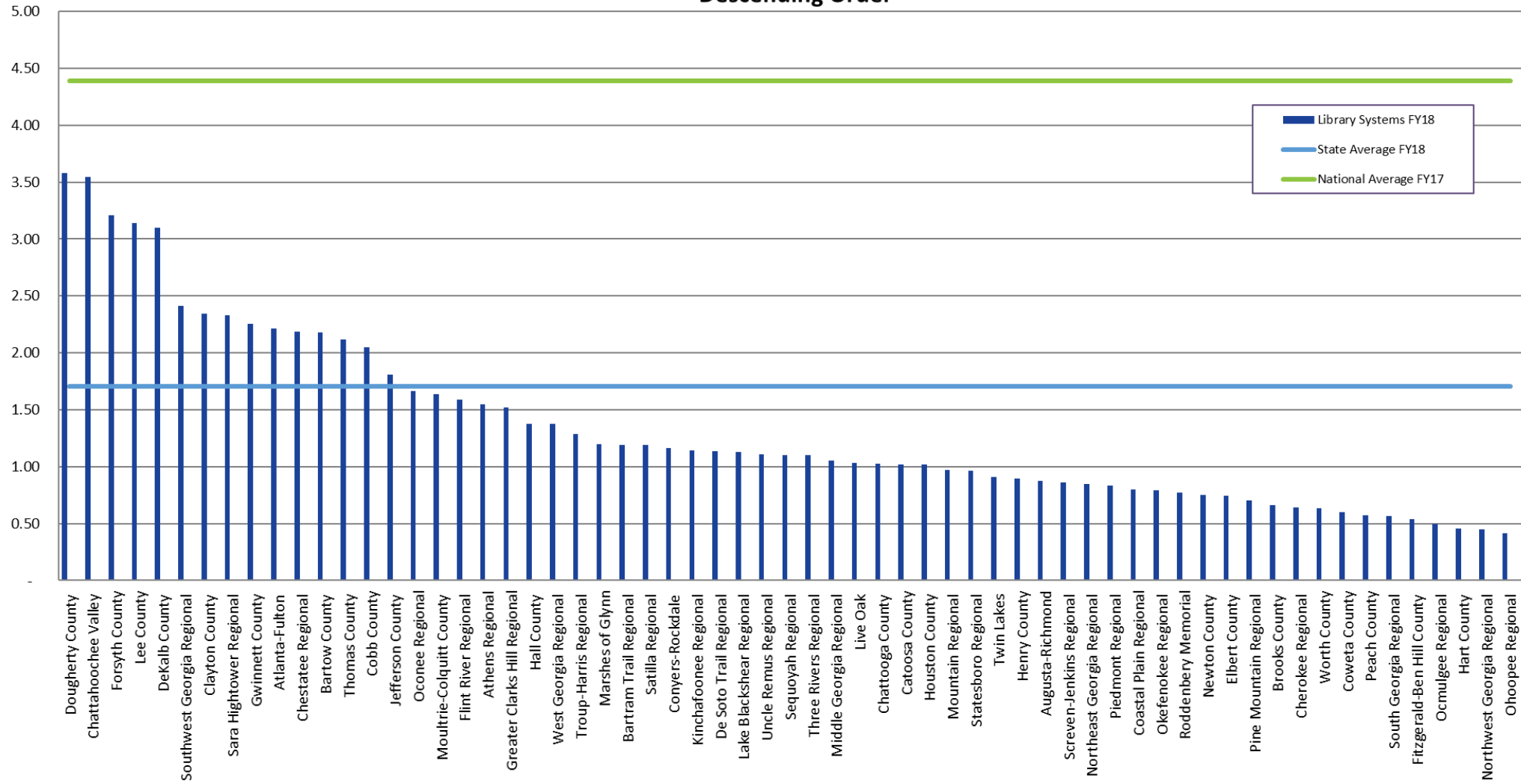

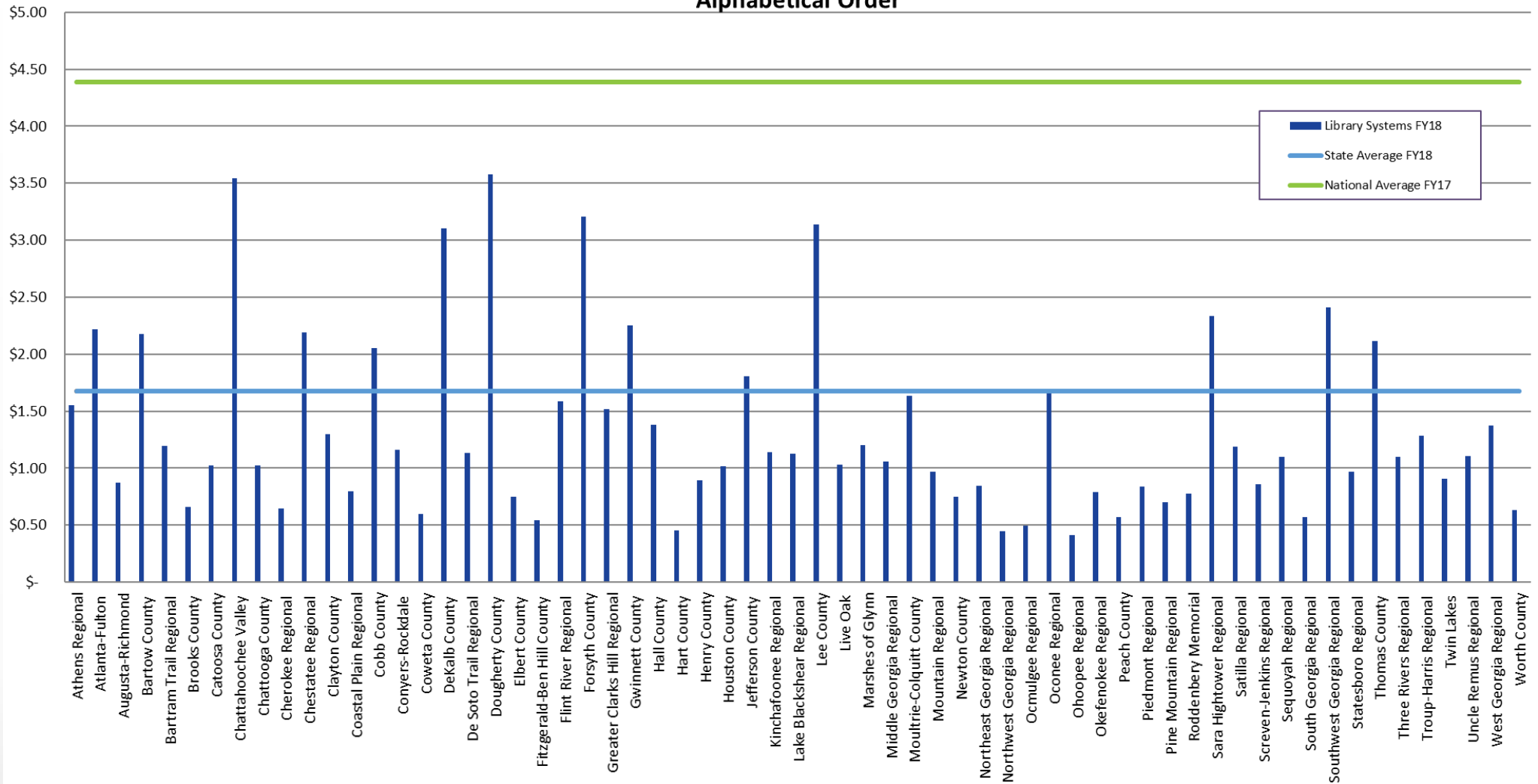
Materials Expenditures Per Capita FY2018

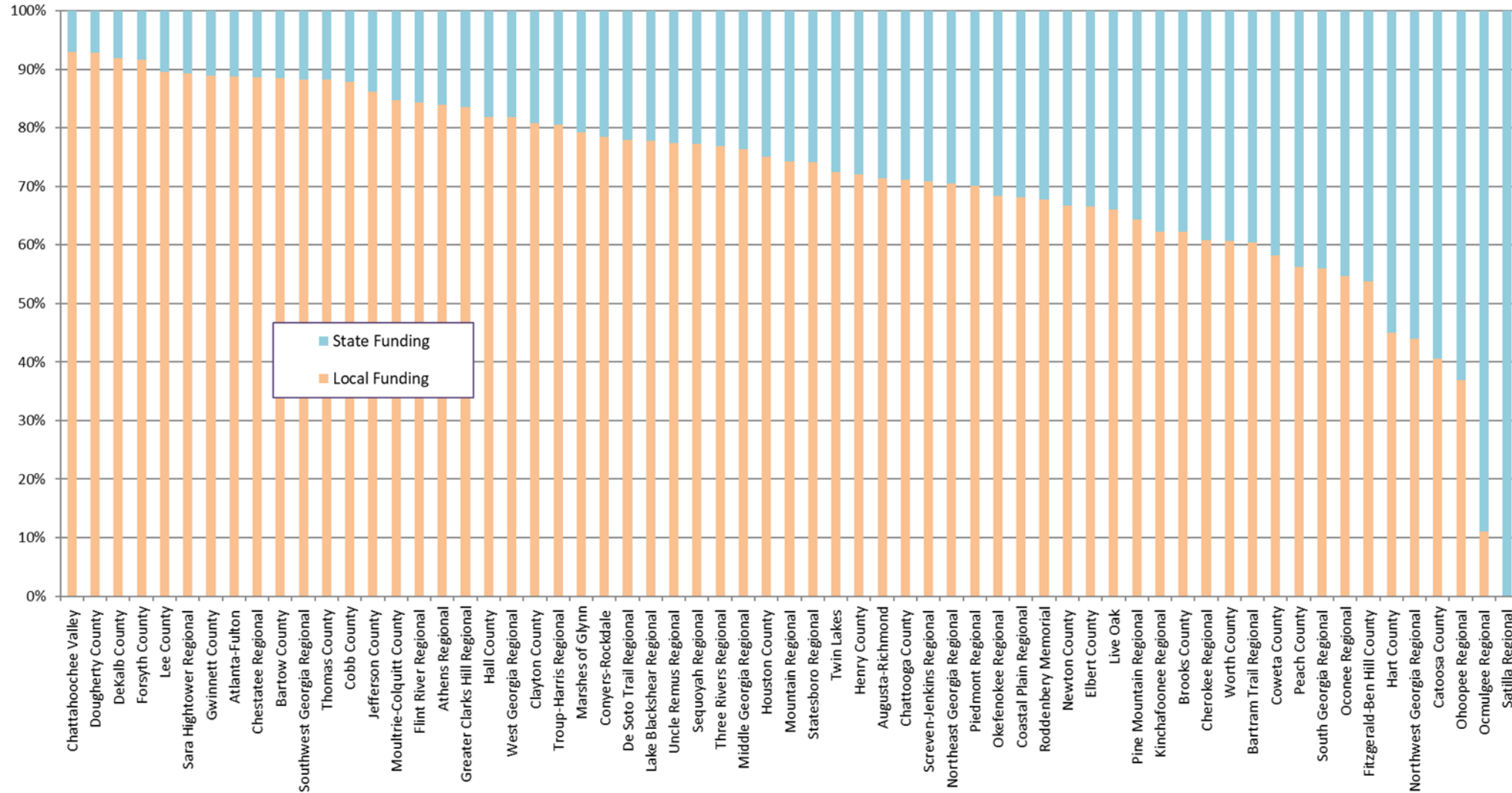


Materials Expenditures Per Capita FY2018

Per Capita Expenditures for Staff in Georgia Public Libraries

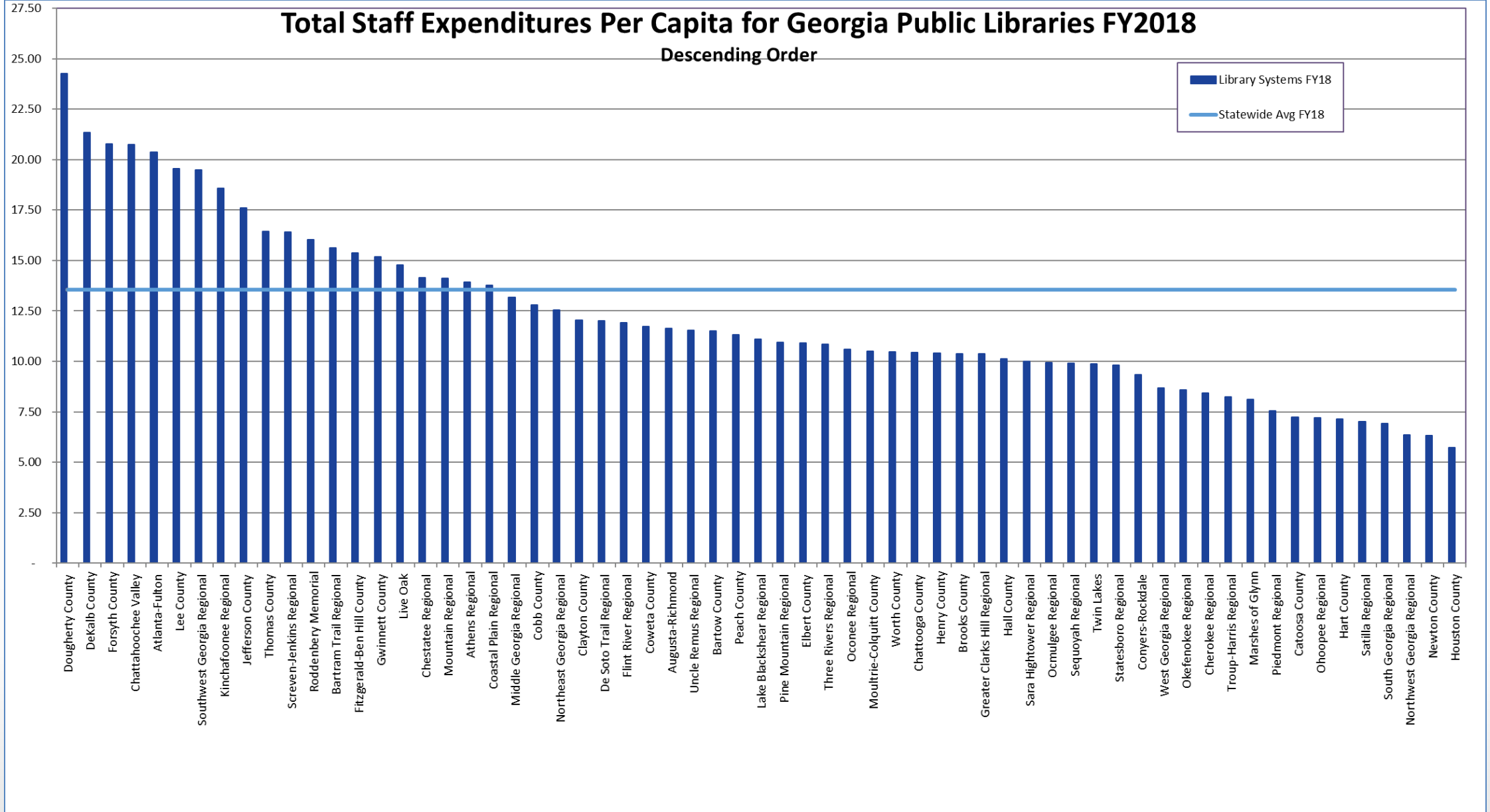
- Georgia public libraries spent an average of \$13.55 per capita for staff in FY2018, a minimal increase of .3% over the FY2017 average of \$13.51.
- The 63 library systems in Georgia ranged from \$5.72 to \$24.26 per capita for staff expenditures.
- The majority (68%) of Georgia public library systems spent less than the state average per capita of \$13.55 for staff salaries, wages, and benefits.
- In FY2017, Georgia ranked 8th among all states at 71.8% when viewing staff salaries and benefits as a percent of all operating expenditures of public libraries.

Total Library Expenditures (includes Staff, Materials, and Other Operating Expenditures)

- Georgia public libraries spent an average of \$18.85 per capita on operating expenditures in FY2018, a negligible .1% increase from the FY19 operating expenditure of \$18.82.. Essentially this remained flat from FY2017 to 18.
- On a per capita basis, all public library systems spent less in FY2018 than the FY2017 national average of \$39.59.
- 32% of Georgia's public library systems spent more per capita than the state average of \$18.55 in FY2018.
- Georgia ranked 49th in the United States for public library total operating expenditures per capita in FY2017.

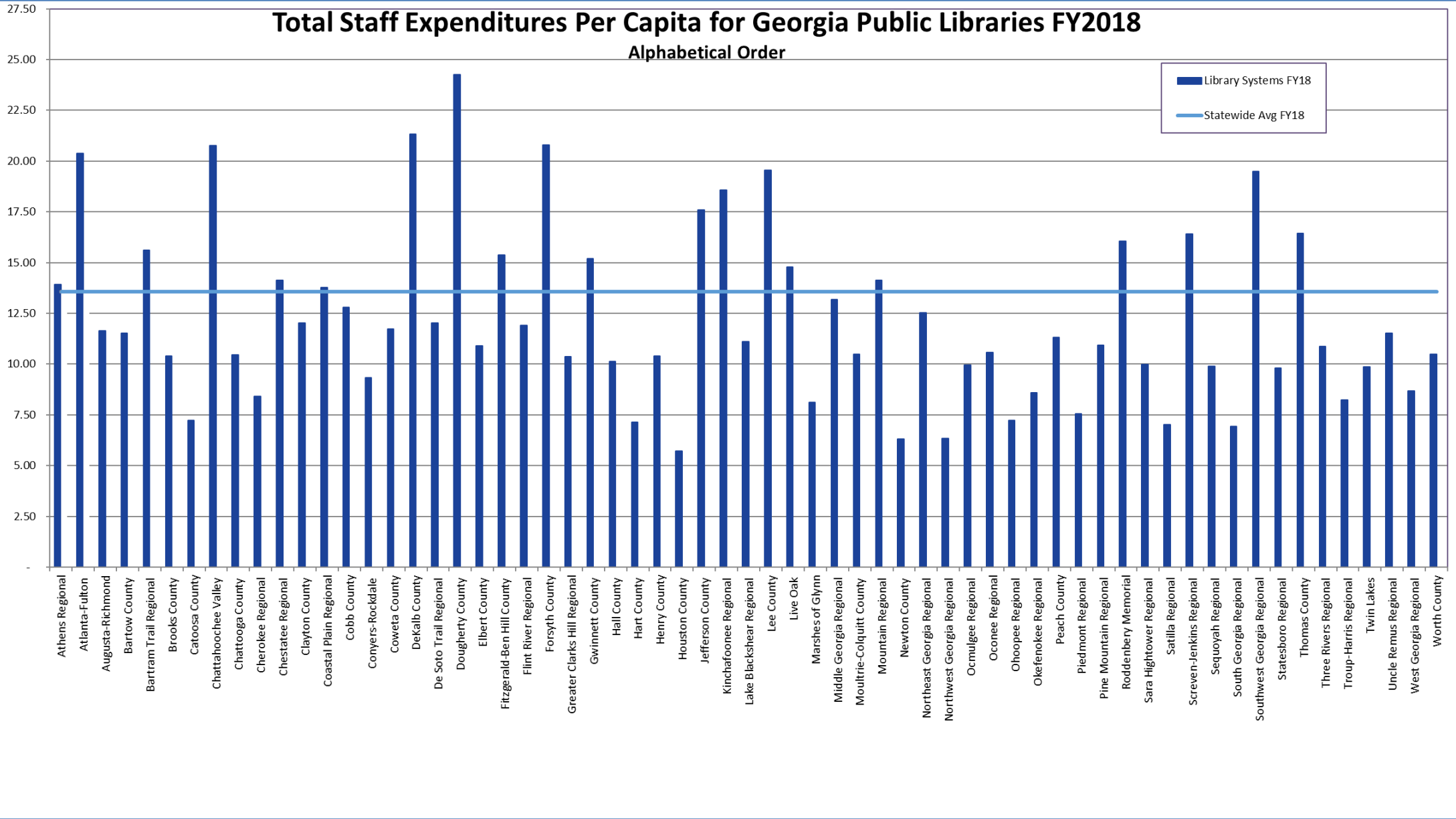
Total Staff Expenditures Per Capita for Georgia Public Libraries FY2018

Total Staff Expenditures Per Capita for Georgia Public Libraries FY2018

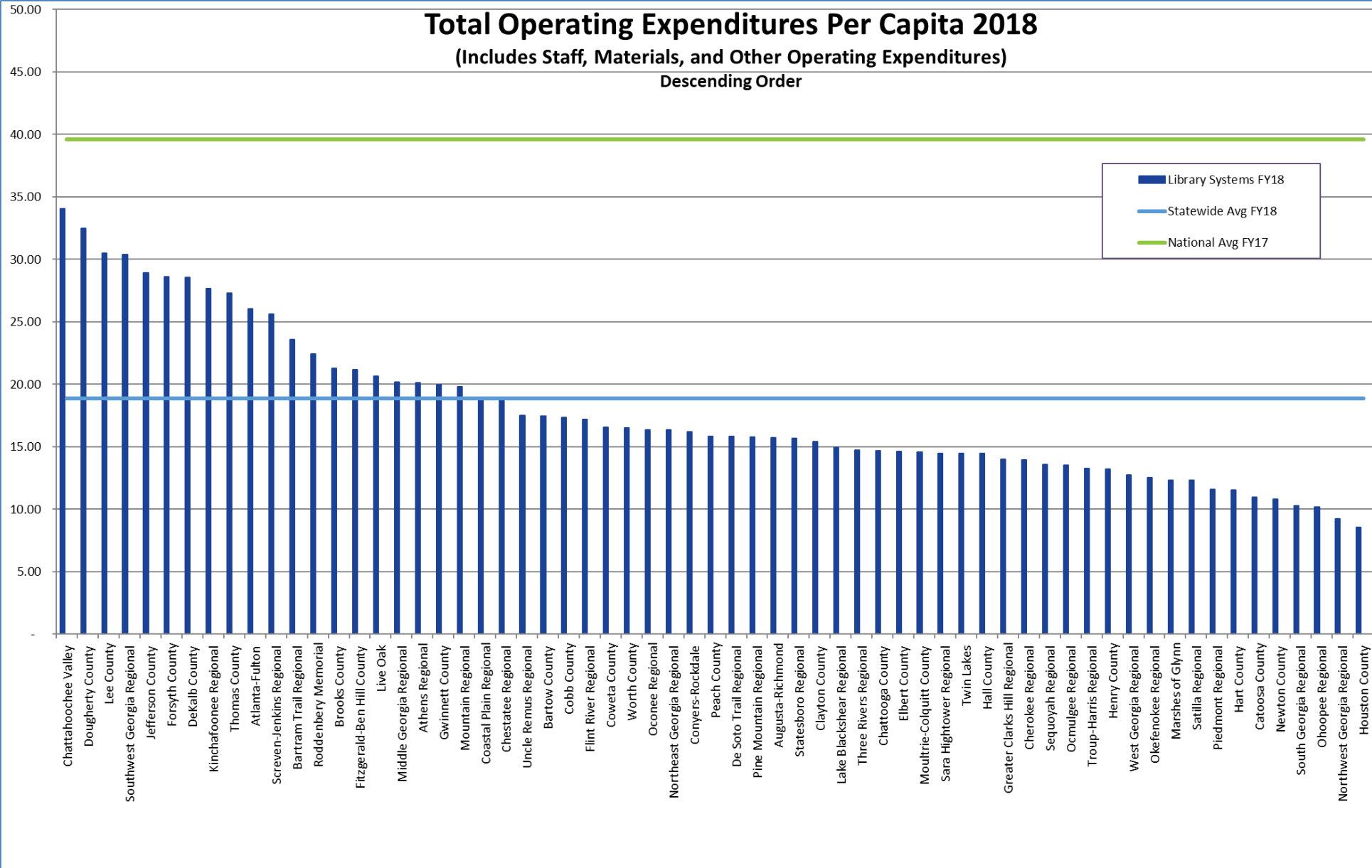

(Includes Staff, Materials, and Other Operating Expenditures)

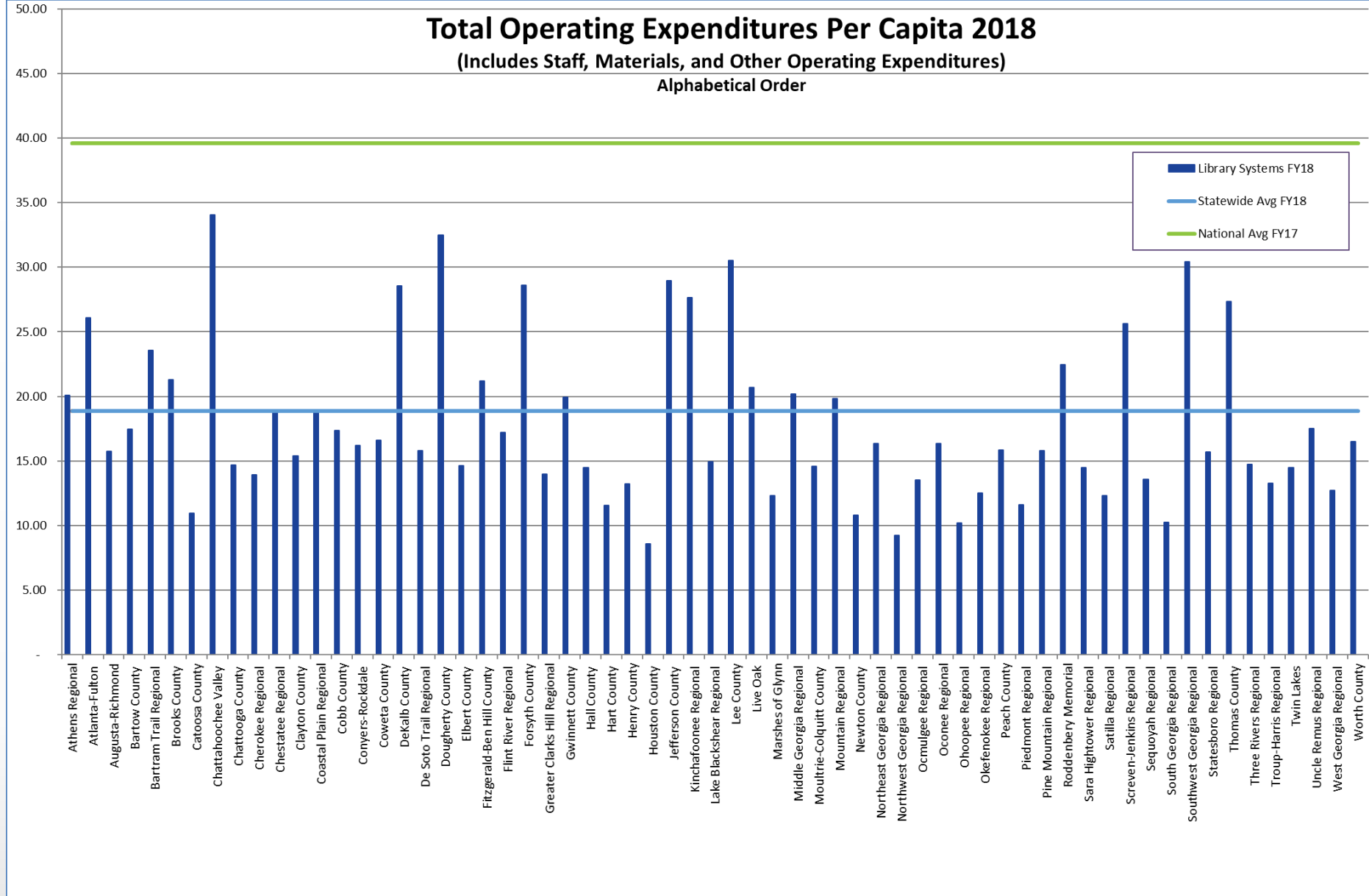

ABOUT GEORGIA PUBLIC LIBRARY SERVICE

Georgia Public Library Service empowers libraries to improve the lives of all Georgians.

We provide scalable library technology and services; staff training, consulting, and best practices; grant administration and more to create equity in library experience for patrons, no matter where they live.

Georgia Public Library Service is the state library administrative agency and a unit of the Board of Regents, University System of Georgia.



Key Services of GPLS for Public Libraries

- Represent and advocate for public libraries at the state and national levels
- Administer state and federal grants
- Administer the capital construction and MRR grant programs
- Provide consulting services through phone and email correspondence and on-site and virtual visits
- Provide training for library staff and trustees
- Promote and facilitate resource sharing and strategic partnerships
- Coordinate statewide programs that promote family literacy for children and parents
- Coordinate statewide library statistics
- Provide funding, support, and management of broadband networks statewide
- Provide centralized support and hosting for cloud computing for public access computers
- Provide web-hosting and email hosting
- Administer and support PINES -- The **P**ublic **I**nformation **N**etwork for **E**lectronic **S**ervices, the Georgia public library automation and lending network
- Provide Help Desk support for PINES and technology needs, available via online access and toll-free phone number
- Provide access to GALILEO, both on-site at all libraries and at home for validated patrons
- Administer GLASS, which provides library services and accessible technology for readers whose physical abilities require the use of books and magazines in audio or braille formats
- Support HomePLACE which encourages digitizing primary source collections
- Provide a professional materials collection

Expenditures and Staffing of GPLS

- In Fiscal Year 2018, total state funding for Georgia Public Library Service was approximately \$37.2 million, over 79% of which was distributed directly to public libraries under the state grants program.
- Georgia Public Library Service used 8.6% of its state budget to fund and coordinate the statewide initiatives of PINES, GLASS, and internet services while 12% was spent on Resource Sharing (GALILEO) and agency operations. This also includes GPLS staff.
- In Fiscal Year 2018, GPLS also administered the IMLS-LSTA State Programs grant expenditures which totaled over \$4.4 million. Funds pay for statewide initiatives such as PINES, GLASS, GALILEO, Georgia HomePLACE, Summer Reading Program, specific grants such as PRIMETIME for early literacy, and agency operations including professional consulting.
- At the end of FY2018, a total of 54 positions were allocated for the Georgia Public Library Service. Only 53 positions were filled, by 49.125 FTEs.
 - GLASS – 17.5 FTE
 - PINES and IT– 15 FTE
 - Library Development – 5.625 FTE
 - Administration and Business Services– 11 FTE

PINES

- Continued to facilitate resource sharing, with intraPINES loans of 689,930
- Circulated 16,491,357 items in FY18
- Over 1.92 million PINES library cards in use during FY18, with 186,012 new cards issued
- Live Oak Public Libraries joined PINES
- Extended and continued to maintain the PINES integrated library computer system in 54 public library systems and served patrons in all 159 Georgia counties
- Contracted with a courier(book delivery) service among all public library system central facilities and University System of Georgia (USG) academic libraries, making the collections of these libraries truly a statewide resource
- Participated in the wider Evergreen community by continuing cooperative software development efforts
- Provided quarterly scheduled training and customized on-demand sessions for the PINES member library systems

General Public Library Support

- Continued to work with libraries and local funding agencies to maintain excellence in services
- Provided continuing support to Friends of Georgia Libraries
- Continued to provide training for library staff and trustees through both instructor-led training on demand and through scholarships to training offered by outside vendors; initiated virtual training during the pandemic
- Provided local strategic planning assistance to public library systems
- Continued to administer and utilize funds provided by the federal Library Services and Technology Act toward the improvement and enhancement of library services in Georgia
- Continued to coordinate, gather, and publish public library statistics for information, decision-making, and advocacy

Planning and Construction

- Consulted with public library stakeholders in the development and implementation of public library design standards
- Continued to work with the Georgia State Financing and Investment Commission in funding for construction and with public libraries in implementation of capital outlay programs
- Coordinated Georgia's public library planning and construction program, a match program assisting in new library construction as well as renovations and additions
- Completed 72 state-funded projects since 2005 with 25 projects in the planning process awaiting awards
- Total grant funding between FY05 and FY18 has been over \$109 million

Youth Services

- In FY2018, helped public libraries strengthen local partnerships with agencies, institutions, businesses, and groups by coordinating LSTA-funded PRIME TIME Family Reading Time® programs at 18 sites in 15 library systems (Chattooga County Library, Chattahoochee Valley Libraries, Cherokee Regional Library System, Coastal Plain Regional Library, Cobb County Public Library System, DeKalb County Public Library, Forsyth County Public Library, Marshes of Glynn Libraries, Middle Georgia Regional Library System, Piedmont Regional Library, Roddenbery Memorial Library System, Southwest Georgia Regional Library System, Three Rivers Regional Library System, Twin Lakes Library System, West Georgia Regional Library)
- 3,361 children and caregivers attended these PRIME TIME programs in FY18

- Provided library services for the blind and others whose physical abilities require the use of books and magazines in audio format or in braille through Georgia Libraries for Accessible Statewide Services (GLASS), a network of libraries and a central distribution center
- GLASS provided materials to 16,496 registered users across Georgia in FY18
- GLASS circulated (mailed) 282,897 items to eligible enrolled readers in Georgia
- GLASS provided access to digital titles that were downloaded 12,993 times in FY18
- GLASS partnered with the NLS affiliate, Multistate Center East, to fill 27,028 requests for NLS titles not available in the GLASS collection
- Promoted emphasis on outreach and patron services at the local level
- Continued to assist readers with the transition from audio cassette to a digital book and magazine collection
- Recorded books by Georgia authors to be added to the BARD digital download catalog
- Continued a partnership with PINES libraries to enhance service delivery for GLASS patrons
- Continued a partnership with Benetech to provide access to Bookshare, a digital collection of 600,000 titles in accessible formats, lending 13,630 digital files
- Planned and hosted the Georgia Accessibility Conference for Georgia's public libraries to learn and discuss best practices in providing inclusive and accessible library services

Information Technology

- Provided a broadband network managed service layer on behalf of Georgia libraries. Ensured a minimum broadband speed and \$4.6 million in Category 1 federal funding through E-Rate application support, including management, contract negotiation, and fiscal and billing reconciliation.
- Hosted and supported over 2,426 cloud-based public access computers for the majority of Georgia public libraries.
- Provided hosting and maintenance for GPLS, GDC, and GLASS Atlanta for G Suite, a cloud-based productivity suite with unlimited, fully networked and secure data-file storage.
- In the process of migrating the majority of Georgia's public library systems to G Suite which will result in over 2000 staff accounts across the state. 18 domains and 773 accounts have been migrated. Over 240 mailing lists have been migrated or created.
- In the form of workshops, presentations and individual talks, provided outreach featuring technology-related services and programming in order to raise awareness of technology trends and adoptions in public libraries.
- Hosted a Technology Boot Camp, an initiative of GPLS to bring together IT professionals from Georgia's public libraries.
- Managed \$2.3 million in state bond funding for technology improvement and upgrades in Georgia public libraries. Assessed technology needs of the libraries and worked with vendors to secure bulk discounts. Processed technology procurement plans and reimbursement packets for payment.
- Circulated 10 Technology Loaner Kits, consisting of over 27 pieces of hardware, allowing staff and patron access to emerging and innovative technologies, including virtual reality, 3D printing, and 360° street view cameras.
- Content creation and management for clearinghouse of current IT trends and practices: galibtech.georgialibraries.org. Converted to a new content management system (Google Sites) and redesign of website pages and structure.

Communications

- Communications and Marketing led the agency's rebranding this year, creating a new logo, website, key messages, collateral, and more. The new look and way we talk about GPLS more clearly articulates the value of public libraries and the work we do to empower their work.
- Library News is our agency's flagship publication and our primary vehicle for keeping legislators, county commissioners, municipal leaders, library patrons, trustees, staff and other stakeholders informed of the social, economic and civic impacts that public libraries and their programs have across the state and in their respective communities. This year, we actively refocused the magazine to share stories of library impact across Georgia instead of simply sharing information. These stories resonate with readers and help them understand why libraries matter. There are 3,500 print copy subscribers, and this year we launched email marketing to share Library News stories and other marketing digitally.
- We launched marketing grants this year to build libraries capacity to market themselves locally. By giving six \$500 mini grants and guiding libraries as they created marketing campaigns, we helped library staff understand how to build a strong campaign and build a case for why they need a marketing budget. 17 libraries applied for these grants.

Continuing Education and Training

- Organized and hosted Marvelous Monday, a one day mini-conference that provided opportunities for paraprofessionals to attend learning sessions on current topics that are relevant and meaningful to the public library world
- Successfully migrated the Georgia Learning Center's (LMS) media content over to Niche Academy (content management system)
- Hosted a one-day interactive grant writing workshop for library staff. This workshop highlighted how to find relevant grant opportunities, how to write grant proposal documents, how to design and implement a grant writing project plan and more.
- Promoted flexible training and continuing education programs in individual library systems by providing public libraries free access to online conferencing platform WebEx

Resource Sharing

- Administered the reciprocal borrowing and lending activity of more than 200 GOLD multitype member libraries resulting in lending 138,358 items and borrowing 113,373 through interlibrary loans during FY18.
- Purchased group access to OCLC Services for all public libraries, including a group catalog, that allows patrons access to resources beyond their library's holdings
- Paid GALILEO resource fees for all 63 public library systems to provide patron access to the statewide virtual library
- Expanded GALILEO resources for public libraries to include online legal forms and animated story books for young children
- Purchased group access to the RDA Toolkit for all public libraries

HomePLACE

- In FY18, HomePLACE, a collaboration with the Digital Library of Georgia (DLG), an initiative of GALILEO, funded over 53,800 new and converted digitized items and associated metadata records to the DLG, including 43,466 newspaper pages.
- In FY18, the DLG updated its portal interface with a new logo and a clean and modern feel. Feature updates included enhanced search and browse features, new collection highlights, impact stories, and an interactive collection map.
- In FY18, the DLG launched the Georgia Historic Newspaper portal, creating a single source for all of Georgia's digitized newspaper content. The portal features advanced search and browse features, sorting by title, county, city, and date, and the ability to clip and download images.
- In FY18, DLG portals containing Georgia public library primary source content had over 3.1 million total page views, while the newly launched Georgia Historic Newspaper portal containing content digitized by HomePLACE garnered over 4.2 million page views.
- Public libraries continued to benefit from the DLG's hub relationship with the Digital Public Library of America (DPLA), with two public library collections in the top-ten most-accessed list of Georgia content in DPLA. Georgia has over half a million items represented in the DPLA, and in FY18, the number one most-accessed DLG item in the DPLA was a photograph contributed by the Hall County Library System.

Strategic Partnerships

- GPLS partners with a number of state and private organizations to provide an additional layer of support and opportunities for library communities and build awareness for the state's public libraries. Since 2015, partnership programs have educated and entertained thousands of Georgia residents saving more than \$16 million in direct expenditures and providing hundreds of hours of free programming
- During FY2018, GPLS continued providing activities and programming with many previous partners and added the Georgia Aquarium, Georgia Public Broadcasting, Georgia Department of Human Services, and the Museum of History and Holocaust Education to the list of partner organizations.
